COMMIT TO GETTING SEVERAL MEMBERS OF YOUR CONGREGATION TO BECOME VOLUNTEER VOTER DEPUTY REGISTRARS

Becoming a Voter Registrar in Texas is simple but does require training either online or in person.

BEGIN REGISTERING YOUR CONGREGATION AND COMMUNITY

Now that you have trained and certified Voter Registrars in your church, begin registering congregants and citizens in every way possible. This may include the church lobby every Sunday leading up to election day, all church events, bible studies, luncheons, sports events, in their neighborhoods, etc.

This is a great way for your church to be in the nearby community educating people, registering them to vote but also reaching them with the Gospel message and inviting them to your church!

PROVIDE RESOURCES TO HELP PEOPLE MAKE SURE THEY ARE REGISTERED TO VOTE IN YOUR COUNTY

- Registering to vote in Texas is easy! So long as you are eligible, you will be able to register to vote in your county of residence to make your voice heard in local, state, and federal elections.

- Texas law requires eligible voters to register by the 30th day before Election Day.
- To confirm your voter registration status, you can visit the Texas Secretary of State's '[Am I Registered?](#)' portal, which allows you to look up your voter registration record in the statewide voter registration database.
